



- **Alliance Family Health Center, Inc.:** \$5,547 to purchase a vaccine refrigeration unit to begin providing patients with necessary vaccinations.
- **Beacon Charitable Pharmacy:** \$6,000 to purchase medications from Dispensary of Hope in Nashville, Tennessee.
- **Canton Museum of Art:** \$3,500 to utilize the museum's exhibitions and art therapist led experience to improve the lives of individuals coping with drug/alcohol dependency, terminal illness and other mental and physical health challenges.
- **Compassion Delivered, Inc.:** \$4,000 to provide medically nutritional meals to people who are coping with chronic, life-threatening illnesses and diseases on a weekly basis, free of charge to the recipient.
- **First Tee of Canton Inc.:** \$1,000 to focus on physical fitness and mental health with young people in the programs throughout the year.
- **Girls on the Run of Stark County:** \$2,750 to deliver the program during the 2018-19 school year for at least 15 girls from low-income families in Stark and Wayne counties.
- **Hannah's House 119:** \$5,000 to reduce infant mortality rates by providing emotional support and teaching important parenting skills to Stark County's young mothers.
- **Healthcare 2000 Community Clinic, Inc./Viola Startzman Clinic:** \$4,000 to provide comprehensive medical, dental, behavioral health, specialty care, case management and social support to uninsured low-income Wayne County patients.
- **Heritage Christian Schools of Ohio, Inc.:** \$5,000 for much-needed counseling for students as they deal with serious issues such as suicide, self-harm, anger, bullying, trauma, etc.
- **Hospice of Tuscarawas County, Inc. dba Community Hospice:** \$5,000 to purchase reclining chairs in Community Hospice inpatient unit with new, more mobile, more comfortable electric reclining chairs.
- **ICAN Inc. dba ICAN Housing:** \$3,550 to immerse 20 ICAN tenants in the operation of the StarkFresh Food Production & Job Skills Training Farm.
- **NW Stark Senior Citizens Center:** \$3,480 to provide bi-monthly educational presentations with healthy snacks and an exercise portion to engage seniors in their own health and wellness.
- **OneEighty, Inc.:** \$5,000 to expand medication assisted treatment (MAT) and integrated physical/behavioral health care to the Wayne/Holmes-county communities by adding a physician to the staff.
- **Pegasus Farm:** \$6,500 to eliminate financial barriers for students in need who wish to participate in services.
- **Project REBUILD Inc.:** \$974 to create a six-month wellness series for members. The goal is to teach and provide the tools to learn how to manage stress and anger in healthy and productive ways.
- **Refuge of Hope Ministries:** \$4,000 to help purchase fresh or canned fruits and vegetables for the meal ministry.
- **Society for Equal Access:** \$5,000 to provide transportation in Tuscarawas County.
- **Stark County T.A.S.C., Inc.:** \$2,500 to provide a home-based counseling service that works with families of youths who are involved in the juvenile justice system and may be at risk of out-of-home placement or suffering from mental illness and substance-use disorders.
- **Stark County Urban Minority Alcohol and Drug Addiction Outreach Project, Inc.:** \$2,500 to assist and advocate for clients who have been left behind in needed services.
- **The Alliance of Churches, Inc.:** \$2,500 to assist clients with utility (electric, gas, water) and rent payments to avoid homelessness.
- **Tiqvah Hands of Hope:** \$5,000 to offer counseling to all Tiqvah students to build self-esteem, self-efficacy and other aspects critical to developing and maintaining a healthy sense of self.

- **Tuscarawas County Challenger Baseball:** \$1,700 to provide AASP equipment for players who have vision problems to play baseball.
